Commissioner Hao said it is a bold decision to not follow the Mayor's budget instructions. Commissioner Hao asked what is the plan if the amount requested is not approved by the Mayor. Iftikhar Hussain said there are two options 1. the department would need to operate with the lesser budget approved which would compromise the department's operations and 2. San Francisco Health Service System would request the Board of Supervisors add back the necessary budget needs. Commissioner Hao asked if the department has been more successful negotiating with the Board of Supervisors than it has been with the Mayor. Iftikhar Hussain said last year the department asked for new positions which were approved by the Mayor. He also stated that this year the City has a general deficit so we are asking for a new type of budgetary request. Commissioner Hao said the Health Service System should ask for what the department needs and be prepared if the budget is not approved by the Mayor.

Commissioner Canning moved to approve the San Francisco Health Service System General Fund Administration 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 Budget. Commissioner Breslin seconded.

Commissioner Scott asked what steps takes place after the Committee approves the budget and the full Board approves on Thursday February 9, 2023. Iftikhar Hussain said the budget will be submitted to the Mayor's Office and announced in early June with any adjustments or changes. The Health Service Board will receive a presentation sharing the budget updates. The Budget and Finance Committee as well as the full San Francisco Board of Supervisors will vote on the final budgets in June and July. Commissioner Scott asked when will the Governor's State Budget proposal fit into the San Francisco City budget process. Iftikhar Hussain said the Governor's revisions will likely be part of the June adjustments. Commissioner Scott asked how the Health Service System be able to respond to any revisions from the Governor. Executive Director Yant said the Governor's public website states the budget will be issued in the summer. Executive Director Yant said the Mayor publicly issues the budget on June 1st which includes any adjustments known at that time. The Health Service System can request the Board of Supervisors add back the funds that were not approved by the Mayor. Commissioner Hao said it might be helpful to review the Controller's nine-month report which is usually released in May because that could also impact the Mayor's budget released on June first. Executive Director Yant said the San Francisco Board of Supervisors will meet in July for the final approval.

Commissioner Hao moved to approve the San Francisco Health Service System Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 proposed Sustainability Fund Budget. Commissioner Breslin seconded the motion.
